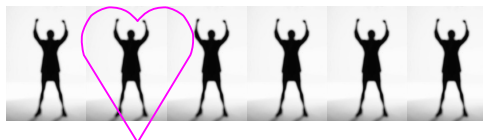


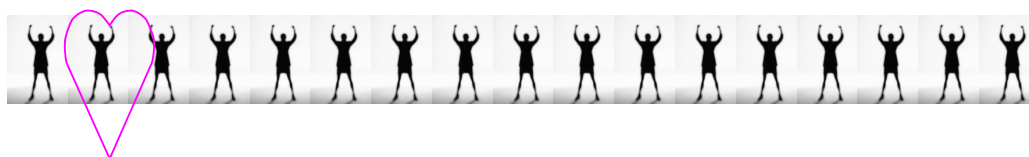
MULTICULTURALISM ON THE SUNSHINE COAST

Many people believe that the Sunshine Coast is a mono-cultural region, but the statistics show us a different story. The following data about the Sunshine Coast region was drawn from the 2006 ABS.

- ❖ One in every six people was born overseas



- ❖ One in every 17 people was born in a Non English Speaking Country

Unlike metropolitan areas, where there are large groups of particular cultures, the Sunshine Coast region is typified by small groups (less than 500) of many cultures. There are 144 non-English speaking countries of birth with less 500 people in fact!

<p>There are only 24 known formal and informal cultural and culturally affiliated religious groups on the Sunshine Coast (CIS 2009), however, the ABS indicates there are people living here from 156 different countries of birth. Therefore, many CALD people do not have access to formal/organized cultural/language based community support.</p>
